#### Code of Conduct

## Drive n' Drop - Entry and Dismissal

We encourage all students to walk to school. It lessens traffic congestion and is great exercise. Should you need to drive your child to school, please be patient in our Drive and Drop lane and follow the rules, or park on a side street and walk onto property.

If you have older children there is no need to come to school before 2:30 pm for dismissal. If you wait until the dismissal bell or a few minutes after before coming to school, a lot of traffic congestion is gone from parents of children in younger grades. Direct your older children to come and wait on the sidewalk in the Drive n' Drop area, closest to the school (not the portables).

At entry, please remember:

- Please **pull forward and all the way up to the end of the Drive and Drop lane** so several cars can stop behind you at the same time.
- Your child to exit the car from the passenger side doors
- Ensure that your child's backpack is in the backseat and within reach for easy exit.
- Do not get out of your car. Staff will help your child exit the vehicle

At dismissal, please remember:

- pick up and drop off at the curb closest to the school, not at the turn near the portables
- walk on the sidewalk and path, not through the parking lot
- do not let your children load or unload the car in the first drive of the laneway; wait until you are around the bend at the sidewalk beside the school
- follow all directions from staff
- be patient, drive slowly!

## Gifted Testing

The DDSB is offering a gifted screening test for students in Grades 3 or higher. The process begins with nominations. Families may nominate students in Grade 3 or above. The week of



**November 6th**, students who have been nominated will participate in an intellectual assessment using a cognitive abilities test called the CCAT. Students may take the test with the DDSB no more than twice.

If you are a grade 3 parent, please fill in the survey emailed to you by your child's teacher even if you DO NOT want your child to participate in testing this year (there is an option to decline testing on the form). If your child is in grades 4

- 8 please contact your child's homeroom teacher or SERT to request the electronic nomination form. The nomination form will be open on **Oct. 3rd at 9:00 a.m.** and will close at **9pm on October 11th, 2023.** Please note that late submissions cannot be accepted.
